Information about the start of school 2026

Dear parents and guardians,

it is important to us that your child enjoys learning, feels comfortable with us, and leaves after four years with strong self-confidence and a solid academic foundation for the rest of their school career.



Extracurricular learning locations and activities

Our school grounds offer plenty of space for a wide range of activities, such as the school garden, school festivals, or sponsored runs. We are also well connected by public transport (line 24), allowing us to take part in external activities. We regularly visit theaters, the Bremen Philharmonic Orchestra, museums, and the cinema. Educational excursions—such as trips to an organic farm, the BUND children’s wilderness area, or Bürgerpark—complement our diverse program. Our annual sports festival is a must, and project days create a special atmosphere. Once during the four years, your child will go on a class trip. These trips contribute greatly to social learning and strengthen the class community.

Cooperation with parents/guardians

A trusting cooperation with you is very important to us. By attending parent evenings and parent-teacher conferences, you can maintain a good exchange with us and learn more about your child’s daily school life. We also value your active participation in school life—for example, accompanying excursions or helping organize school events.

As a class parent representative, you can actively contribute to planning and shaping school life through the parents’ council. In addition, our school has had a school association for over 20 years, where parental involvement is also welcome.

Both the parents’ council and the school association are introduced in this booklet. They are essential for shaping school life and are always open to new ideas.

We look forward to working with you!

Reliable primary school hours (8:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.)

Until summer 2026, our school will not yet be a full-day school. We are currently planning with the authorities to introduce a full-day program by summer 2027. For now, after 1:00 p.m., childcare is still available in after-school care (“Hort”), which must be organized by parents themselves. We understand that this may not be satisfactory for families.
